"Consider the **lilies** how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. If then God so clothe the grass, which is today in the field, and tomorrow is cast into the oven; how much more will he clothe you, O ye of little faith?"

--- Luke 12: 27 & 28

"April showers bring May flowers..."

In the year 1,157 A.D. an Englishman by the name of Thomas Tusser wrote a few simple lines in the form of a poem that communicated the (directly above) bold-faced print. As an ode of sorts to Springtime Tusser told in beautiful verse the coming reality of the gradual change of the climate in the form of Spring flowers. England has long had weather patterns that make rain and fog a daily and accepted part of everyday life. Umbrellas are a staple of traditional English garb, being always in hand or nearby for when the sky opens up and blesses the ground with heavenly moisture. The poem was also a gently worded verse of sympathy that spoke to the human condition of the value of waiting and getting through tough times knowing better times are coming. Such might be one of the origins of the English emotional staple of keeping the "stiff

upper lip."

The Bible also occasionally mentions the beauty and majesty of flowers in verses from the Hebrew Scriptures (the Old Testament) and the New Testament in the words of Jesus. Printed above, from Luke chapter 12, we see an excerpt from a longer conversation Jesus is having with his disciples (and, thus, also us) about the great waste of time that is worrying or being anxious. "Therefore, I tell you, do not worry about your life..." we read in verse 22. "Who of you, by worrying, can add a single hour to his life? Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest?" (vs. 25 & 26.) Notice how Jesus refers to the extending of our worldly life as a "very little thing." When was the last time we put the reality of our physical life into such a stark moment of realization? Jesus continually looks to eternal life as the life that has the most value. Why are you worrying and scrabbling for that which is passing so quickly? Such is the challenge God sends our way, through Jesus Christ, who has the reigns of control firmly in grasp, and who reminds us that even though the lilies are so utterly beautiful today, tomorrow they are thrown into the fire. Surely, if he loves and keeps them so well, as transient as they are, will he not also care and keep us, all the more, "O ye of little faith!" (vs. 28b.)

While life may be presenting us with showers right now, while we might be suffering and having to endure any number of the indignities that life sends our way right now, the funny little poem by Mr. Tusser, and the majestic words of Christ remind us that there are better times ahead, whether in this world or in the next.

"April showers bring May flowers." May we enjoy the day God has blessed us with today, if it is possible, and may we always keep our hearts and minds on tomorrow which has been won for us through the majesty, power and sacrifice of our Lord and Savior. Volume 63, Issue 04

The Easter celebration continues...

Well, we spent our 40 days (not including Sundays) in the Lenten Season, preparing us for Holy Week and Easter. So, what happens now? Well, we don't just pack up the plastic Easter Eggs and say "So long...see you next year." The Easter celebration continues for 50 days, terminating on Pentecost, which this year is May 19th.

We number the Sundays as the nth Sunday OF Easter (not the nth Sunday AFTER Easter) because the celebration is meant to be on-going. Christ is RISEN! He is RISEN INDEED. We say that every year, and during the Sundays leading up to Pentecost, our lessons will concentrate not on the resurrection, but how we respond to it! We'll be reminded who Jesus is, what he did, and, most importantly, what he expects US to do.

Musically, we're back to a full musical liturgy, with a weekly Hymn of Praise, and songs that proclaim "Alleluia". We'll sing songs of the resurrection and share the peace of Christ with those around us in church.

The solemnity of Lent is over...CHRIST IS RISEN! Let us be GLAD and celebrate!
